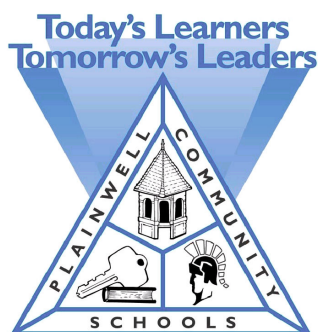


# Plainwell High School On Top With 2006 MEAP Composite Percentages

Four years ago, the staff and students at Plainwell High School set their sights on being the best high school in southwest Michigan and they are certainly on their way! One very important measure of their success is how well the students perform on the annual MEAP test.

The High School MEAP test is comprised of 5 sub tests: reading, writing, math, social studies, and science. This is the test that the State of Michigan uses to assess the progress/success of public schools. Each year the percentages of graduating students that meet or exceed the state standards on each sub-test from 38 area high schools in southwest Michigan are printed in the Kalamazoo Gazette. If all graduating seniors in a high school met or exceeded the state standards on all sub-tests, their composite percentage would be 500%. Plainwell High School students have continued to improve their performances on the MEAP over the past four years. Attached are the composite percentage scores for the Class of 2006 from 38 high schools in southwest Michigan.
