She reported continued work with the Chamber of Commerce to find a new Director. Finally, she noted that Plainwell Kayak Company plans to open on Memorial Day weekend.

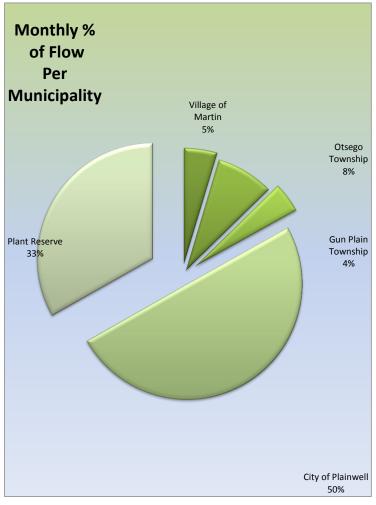

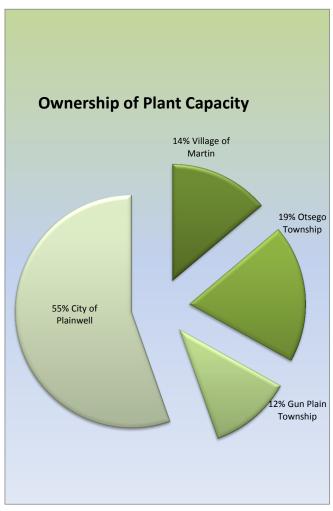
