## Riverwalk Park



Riverwalk Park is a scenic linear park that connects Hicks Park, Fannie Pell Park, the Bandshell, and Sherwood Park via wood boardwalks, concrete walkways, and the Trestle Bridge crossing the Kalamazoo River.

## Fannie Pell Park

This one-acre park is located at the convergence of the Mill Race and Kalamazoo River, in front of City Hall (211 N. Main St.). The park features sculptures, a scenic gazebo, restroom, kayak livery, and is a popular fishing spot.

## Hicks Park

Hicks Park, located at 101 Allegan Street, is the oldest park in Plainwell, dating back to 1903. Many community events are held here, such as the Tree Lighting Ceremony and Egg Hunt. This park has play equipment, picnic tables, grills, and a pedestrian/dog fountain.

## Bandshell

Located at 205 Anderson Street with a backdrop of the river, the bandshell often hosts concerts in the summer.

## Thurl Cook Park

This two-acre park can be accessed from both Oak St. and Glenview Circle. It has many amenities including new pickleball courts, tennis courts, a pavilion, restroom, play equipment, and a large dog park.

## Sherwood Park

Located at 121 N Sherwood Ave, along the east bank of the Kalamazoo River, this three-acre park is a family favorite. It has a large playground, picnic tables, basketball courts, and is right next to Dean's Ice Cream. A Veterans Memorial is also located in this park.

## Darrow Park

Darrow Park is a small .37-acre roadside park along the Kalamazoo River. It can be accessed from Hicks Street. This park has picnic tables and is often used for fishing access.

## Kenyon Park

Kenyon Park is a 31.5-acre park located at 929 Lincoln Parkway, near the city's industrial park. The park features three softball fields with bleachers, a recently upgraded pavilion with picnic tables, playground equipment, and restrooms.
